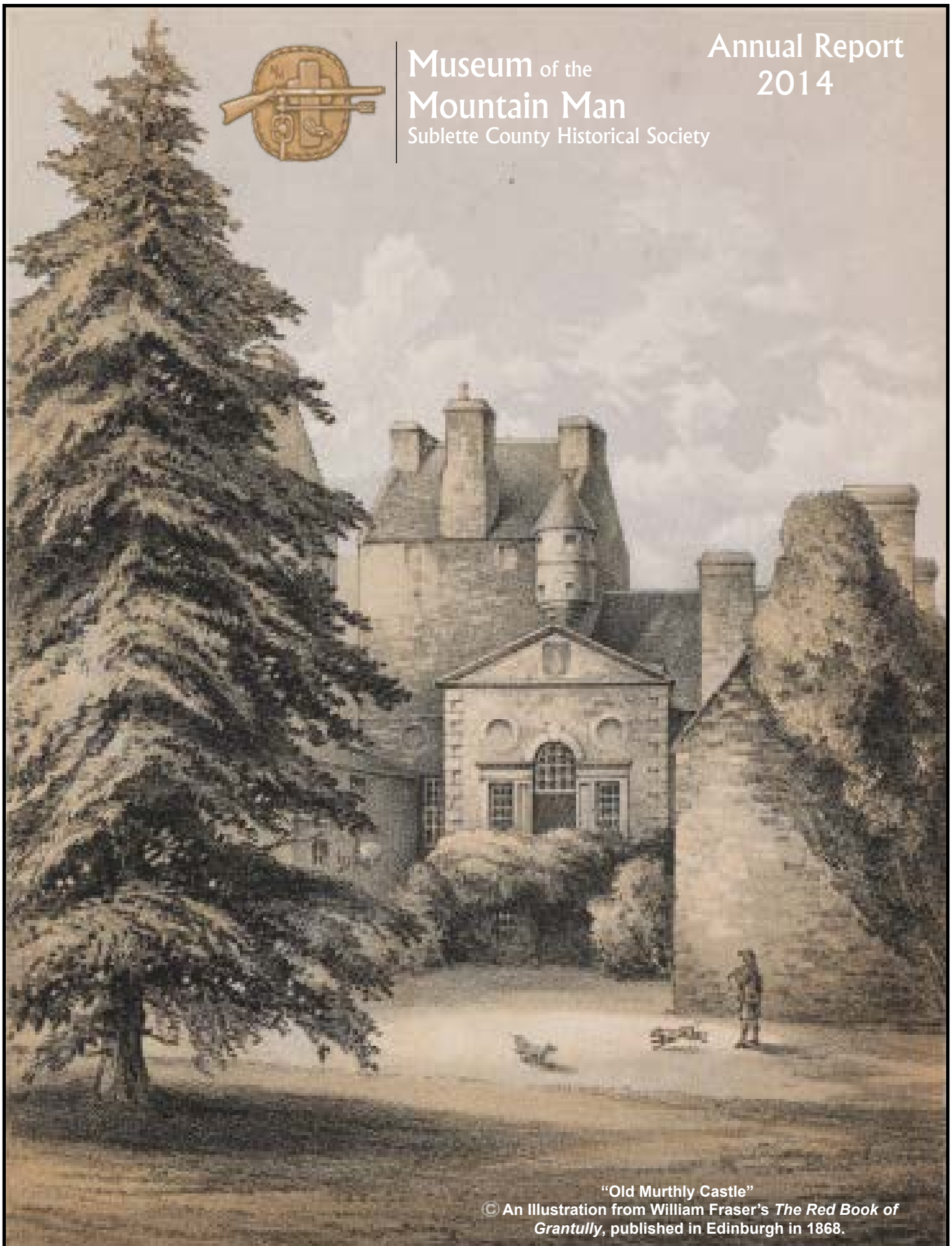

Our Year in Review



The programs and activities sponsored by the Sublette County Historical Society/ Museum of the Mountain Man alongside the exhibits, collections and publications become more and more popular every year. 2014 was another exceptional year, evident by the growing number of visitors from neighboring states and international countries, who travel out of their way to experience our extraordinary history.

The SCHS/ MMM hosts four major events every year. We also open our grounds and facilities for other businesses, organizations and conference-goers, upon request, to showcase our beautiful Museum and welcome their historical inquisition.

YEARLY EVENTS

Our four major programs are generously sponsored by various entities, businesses and corporations every year. These sponsors help us reach out to a broader audience and assist us in meeting our goals and objectives through much-needed finance and man-power. Their connection and involvement with the Museum and Historical Society enable us to offer these projects and programs free to the public.

2014 opened with the Society and Museum's "Annual Meeting and Spring Thaw Party" on March 13th. During the business portion of the evening, Board President, Sam Drucker, introduced and thanked Sublette County Museum Board members, alongside Historical Society board members who previously served on our board and committees, giving so much of their time and energy to the organization.

Ronnie Wilson was the only Trustee leaving the board this year. President Drucker cited his quiet and thoughtful input during meetings, and thanked him for his 8 years of service to all of us. Officers elected for a second term in 2014 were: **President – Sam Drucker and Vice-President – Geoff Sell.**

Quickly on the heels of the Annual Meeting and May 1st opening, we welcomed back the **American Mountain Men Association for Living History Days, May 13 – 15th, 2014.** Graciously sponsored by **Sublette County School District # 1 BOCES** for the past 13 years, nearly 1,000 school children, teachers, parents and chaperones from all over western Wyoming attended this popular event.

The **AMM** consists of professional individuals dedicated to the traditional, cultural and historical accuracy of the fur trade era, mountain men and rendezvous system.

Green River Rendezvous Days were held July 10-13th in 2014 and, again, provided 35 educational programs over the four-day weekend, ranging in topics from the scholarly to children's activities. Presentations and educational seminars were presented by the five authors of the *RMFT Journal*; the American Mountain Men Association and **Bad Hand** set up their historical encampments while **Lapita Frewin** led eight Native American craft sessions for children of all ages. These venues were generously sponsored by corporations: **Anderson Ranch, the Sublette County Museum Board, School District #1 BOCES, EnCana, Linn Energy and Rocky Mountain Power.** Our local **SWEP I (Shell CO)** also sponsored and manned the annual Buffalo Burger Fry.

As special guest for Green River Rendezvous Days, the SCHS/ MMM and entire community welcomed Thomas Steuart Fotheringham, Laird of Murthly Castle and Strathbraan Estates of Perthshire, Scotland. As a descendant of Sir William Drummond Stewart, this was Laird Fotheringham's first trip to his ancestral roots and he participated in all aspects of the four-day events.

Elizabeth (Betsy) Watry joined our staff as Curator of the Collection on November 1st. Betsy holds a Master's Degree in History from Montana State University and is an author/ co-author of several books.

The twenty-first Annual Wreath and Chocolate Auction kicked off the holidays at the Pinedale Library Lovatt Room on December 5th and we had the best year yet. Thanks to all the volunteers and beautiful wreaths, the annual fundraiser netted \$16,156 with the help of long-time sponsor, **1st Bank**, providing the evening's refreshments.

Sommers Homestead Living History Museum

The Sommers Homestead Living History Museum completed its third year, opening to the public in 2012. The facility was open Fridays and Saturdays from 10AM to 3PM during June, July and August. During the spring and fall off-season, the Homestead was open by appointment and for school group tours in May, September and October.

The Homestead had 1170 visitors in 2014 including 15 youth groups totaling 479 kids from Big Piney, Pinedale, Farson, Green River, Lander and Rock Springs. The Homestead is all-volunteer-run and admission is by donation. At least 979 hours were donated by 37 different volunteers, and funding to date has been through private donations and grants.

In 2014 the Homestead was pleased to receive a grant from the Wyoming Cultural Trust Fund, to purchase four life-sized fiberglass livestock animals to put in the barn for hands-on living history demonstrations. Those animals included a milk cow that can really be milked, a work horse, a saddle horse, and a small pony. Also new at the homestead was the addition of a small gift shop with items that relate to homesteading.

Located 7.2 miles south on the East Green River Road, the site interprets the homestead era in the Upper Green River Valley during of the 1900s. It is jointly managed by the Sublette County Historical Society, the Green River Valley Museum, and siblings Jonita and Albert Sommers.

In addition to private donations and income from the gift shop, a 'Friends of the Sommers Homestead' program has been started to help raise funds to support the living history programs and operations of the Homestead historical site. Volunteers are always welcomed to help with the demonstrations, school group tours, maintenance and operations.

Lander Trail- New Fork River Crossing Historical Park Dedication

The Lander Trail-New Fork River Crossing Historical Park held its official Grand Opening on June 21, 2014. The site has been under development for the previous four years as archaeological surveys were being conducted and infrastructure construction was in progress.

Approximately 200 people attended the Grand Opening, including 18 representatives of the 29 organizations that contributed in making the new historical park possible.

The celebration included presentations by founding partners, an awards ceremony, and finally a ribbon cutting to officially open the trail through the park. A lunch was paid for by a private donation and served by the Pinedale Lion's Club.

In 2014, at least 200 individual and 29 organizations donated thousands of hours and more than \$1,300,000 to purchase, develop and maintain the site. The park is unstaffed, but maintained by volunteers. The park was open to the public from June 21st through November during 2014. Visitors were welcome to explore a one-mile self-guided walking trail with nine historical interpretation signs at points of interest. The park had approximately 900 visitors during its first season.

The new 100-acre historical park is located where the Lander Trail, a portion of the Oregon Trail, crosses the New Fork River in Sublette County. The land was purchased by the Sublette County Historical Society with contributions as part of mitigation for project work in the nearby Pinedale Anticline natural gas field that impacts the Lander Trail. The park includes ½ mile of New Fork River frontage that has public fishing access. The park is an ongoing project that interprets the Oregon Trail emigrant migration history and experiences at a significant river crossing and campsite along the travelers' journey between 1859 to 1869.

Fur Trade History Travels to Scotland in 2014

“The 176th Anniversary of William Drummond Stewart and Alfred Jacob Miller
at the 1837 Green River Rendezvous”

The Sublette County Historical Society/ Museum of the Mountain Man was pleased to present and co-sponsor a Rocky Mountain Fur Trade Forum and Three Worlds Meet this past September in Scotland. The programs offered a fascinating blend of history, art and culture at Murthly Castle and Strathbraan Estates of Perthshire and the Birnham Institute in Birnham-Dunkeld. The heritage of the fur trade, mountain men and rendezvous era 1820-1840 was presented to over 500 people in the area.

History forums, a full encampment and demonstrations from the American Mountain Men Association, Shoshone Indian speeches, as well as tours of William Drummond Stewart’s castle hall and Chapel were held for the public during the day on September 6th and 7th.

The 3WM presentations were spearheaded by historians and authors James C. Auld, Jerry Enzler and Jim Hardee.

It involved numerous actors, mountain men, a Native American contingency of Shoshones, as well as scholars, historians and theatre personnel. All participated in two evening performances at the Birnham Institute, as well as attending primary schools in the district.

The 1837 Rendezvous was a pivotal year when Alfred Jacob Miller rendered over 900 watercolors, pen and ink sketches, and dozens of paintings of the Green River Valley. He embellished the rich and extraordinary encounters of mountain men, Native American cultures and the diversity of American and European fur trade business.

Presenting this heritage of the Museum of the Mountain Man, the Green River Valley and the significance of the Scotland connection was a goal and dream come true for many who traveled there and participated.

The Publication Corner

The Sublette County Historical Society and the Museum of the Mountain Man are proud to announce that *Obstinate Hope: The Western Expeditions of Nathaniel J. Wyeth, Vol. 1*, written by Jim Hardee, has been awarded a Wyoming State Historical Society book award.



Wyoming State Historical Society book awards are intended to recognize individuals who have made significant contributions to the preservation of the history of Wyoming and the West.

Obstinate Hope: The Western Expeditions of Nathaniel J. Wyeth
Volume 1, 1832 - 1833 by Jim Hardee \$24.95

This was the third award that the SCHS/MMM received from the Wyoming State Historical Society in the past five years. The first was *Pinedale, Wyoming: A Centennial History 1904-2004*, a historic work written and researched by historian Ann Noble. The second was the *Rocky Mountain Fur Trade Journal*, in its "Magazines and Newspapers" category. And the third was Mr. Hardee's book.

Volume 8 of the *Rocky Mountain Fur Trade Journal* was presented in conjunction with Green River Rendezvous Days, July 10-13th.

Published in this year's journal was an article about William H. Ashley's newly-discovered journal the Museum had the privilege of displaying this summer.
