The Museum of the Mountain Man, Pinedale, Wyoming, invites authors to submit articles for publication in the award-winning Rocky Mountain Fur Trade Journal. Published each July, the Journal strives to showcase new research, ideas, and discoveries regarding the Rocky Mountain fur trade era of the early 1800s. All writers, including scholars, students, American Mountain Men members, and fur-trade enthusiasts, are welcome. New authors are encouraged.

Articles are assessed by the Journal's editorial staff and peer reviewed by experts in the field to ensure quality. The Journal accepts both long and short articles, and pays up to \$1000 cash reward upon publication.

Authors are also invited to make a presentation in person when the volume is introduced to the public during the annual Green River Rendezvous, held the second weekend in July at the Museum of the Mountain Man.

THE MUSEUM OF THE MOUNTAIN MAN

The Museum of the Mountain Man is in Pinedale, Wyoming, in the heart of Rocky Mountain fur trade country. Its mission is to preserve and interpret the history of the Rocky Mountain fur trade. The Green River Valley was a favorite location for fur trappers' rendezvous in the 1830s, and accordingly many important historic events occurred here. Numerous renowned fur trade personalities passed through this area for more than three decades.

Opened in 1990, the Museum of the Mountain Man has gained a national reputation for its interpretation of one of America's legendary eras. In addition to noteworthy exhibits, the museum offers educational programs and experiential learning opportunities for all ages. Visiting scholars deliver engaging presentations and hands-on demonstrations that explore and define the history of the

mountain man, Plains Indian culture, and the area's natural history. To further its intellectual mission, the museum collaborates with eminent scholars and historians from around the country. The museum's peer-reviewed publication, the *Rocky Mountain Fur Trade Journal*, represents an annual culmination of that effort.

The museum collection includes a comprehensive and expanding fur trade library containing more than 7,000 volumes, available to scholars for in-house research. The museum is open to the public daily May 1 through October 31 and by appointment November through April. The museum's staff conducts special projects and regular business year-round.

THE SUBLETTE COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The mission of Sublette County Historical Society (SCHS) is to collect, preserve, and interpret the history of the Upper Green River Valley and Sublette County, Wyoming. Established in 1935, SCHS is the oldest historical society in Wyoming. In 1936, the SCHS inaugurated a living history pageant to celebrate the history of the fur trade era and the historic mountain man rendezvous, which evolved into an annual event that has endured to the present day.
